- I. Meeting called to order at 6:40 by Harry Budisidharta
- II. Guests
  - a. Chris Wanifuchi APDC
    - i. Founded 32 years ago to provide services to refugees from SE Asia
      - 1. PTSD and other mental health services
    - ii. Current services
      - 1. Victims support (women and children victims of domestic abuse)
      - 2. ESL education, citizenship, job readiness programs
      - 3. Youth services
      - 4. Interpreters banks
    - iii. New Building open house on June 14
      - 1. Will also provide integrated health services
    - iv. Serve all of Colorado: Asians, immigrants, and refugees (we receive approximately 2,000 refugees each year and it takes an average of 8 months for them to find jobs)
    - v. Policy related efforts
      - 1. Also working on family reunification
        - a. Immigration policies to bring families to US and/or maintain families that are here
      - 2. Informing the community about the Colorado benefit health exchange
      - 3. Addressing the mental health parity
  - b. Senator Jessie Ulibarri (district 21 Adams County)
    - i. Large Latino, Hmong, and Vietnamese populations in his district
    - ii. New initiative to conduct more research on underserved communities
      - 1. Sponsors: Angelo Williams (H); Joe Salazar (H), Irene Aguilar (S)
        - a. Will send Harry more information with bill number
    - iii. Colorado Road and Community Safety Act (Drivers License Bill)
      - 1. Current policy discourages honesty because people still need to drive so many people continue to drive without the ability to get a drivers license or ID card
      - 2. Bill: anyone who is a resident of Colorado (living here 30 days or intent to live here → document with address), pass written and driving exam, IRS # ??, certification that you have filed your taxes, ID from country of origin (passport with or without valid VISA, military identity document, or consulate document)
        - a. Support from 50+ faith based organizations and 300+ businesses

- 3. Ensure that they are long-term Colorado residents, pays tax, and is who they say they are
- 4. Over half of undocumented immigrants originally came here legally
  - a. Many continue to pay taxes by getting an individual tax payer ID (not a SSN)
- 5. We would be the fifth state to have this policy if it passes
- 6. Hickenlooper wants it to be bipartisan
  - a. 17 democratic Senators have signed onto the bill
  - b. 1 republican Senator is ready to support and 3 are on the fence
  - c. Aiming to have it leave the senate with 24-25 votes
- 7. Next committee hearing on Wednesday
- 8. Motion: Fully support bill
  - a. First: Donna
  - b. Second: Marge
  - c. Passed unanimously
- c. Maria Cheng Theatre Esprit Asia
  - i. First Asian American theater company in the Rocky Mountain region
  - ii. Have raised enough funds to cover their first year of production
    - 1. Looking for additional funding and all donations are tax deductible
  - iii. Group ticket rate: 10 tickets for \$13 per ticket + 2 free tickets (\$130 for 12 tickets)
    - 1. Individually: \$17 advanced purchase; \$20 at the door

  - a. Identify ways to inform constituents about the new policies related to health insurance through the Affordable Care Act
- IV. Political Advocacy
  - a. Asian American Justice Center
    - i. Looking for people with personal stories to approach Senator Bennett who can share personal stories about families that have been separated → bill to promote family reunification
    - ii. Debate between Mike Coffman and Andrew Romanoff
      - 1. League of Women Voters has agreed to help us with this but have attempted this before

  - b. Cherry Blossom Festival
    - i. Ngoc did an amazing job proposing many options
