III. TREASURER'S REPORT

- a. PC Holiday Issue

IV. SPEAKER

- a. Patricia Tabbilos (APDC) Will talk about the health benefits exchange and the women's wellness connection
 - Free breast examination and cervical cancer examination. 50+ free breast examination and mammogram. Spread the word about early screening.
 They are asking us to help spread the word about breast cancer awareness.
 Free Wellness Screening Day: Oct 24th. 10am-2pm. Funding is coming from the State through a grant.
 - ii. Connect for Health Colorado. You can purchase health insurance regardless of preexisting health conditions. Go online for comparisons of 150 different types of health insurances and different dental plans. New resources are available based on income. Anonymous eligibility is available. APDC is available to assist with enrollment for insurance. Advice is given by brokers, not APDC. Open enrollment starts Oct. 1st (not quite ready, but will most likely start Oct. 11. Deadline for enrollment for Jan. 1 coverage is Dec. 15. Individual open enrollment ends March 1. For assistance, call 1 (855) 346-3432. Who are eligible? Medicaid members are not eligible for Connect for Health Colorado. After open enrollment ends and you have not registered, there will be a \$95 for the whole year and will increase per year.

- iii. Patricia to send electronic fliers to Harry for newsletter and hard copy fliers in Japanese and Chinese for Sakura Square. Patricia will need to request Japanese flier. Patricia is available to give group clinics.
- iv. APDC is asking for JACL to help spread the word about Connect for Health Colorado.
- b. Kathryn White (Facing History) Will talk about how Mile High JACL can collaborate with Facing History
 - i. Facing History trains middle school and high school teachers. Starts with essential question, such as "What kind of person does a Health Democracy need?" Question is to be revisited throughout the semester/school year. Dr. Vincent Harding says our democracy is still in the lab trying to figure out what our democracy will look like. Studies failures in democracy to learn from mistakes. Answers to the question: Not afraid to speak out, active in the community, courage, compassionate, engaged. Workshops for teachers: why is identity important? Memory and legacy of peoples. End with "Why is this important to me?" Students are more aware of bullying and communities who are welcomed and not welcomed.
 - ii. I Learn America film at the Denver Film Festival next year. Film maker and some of the students in the film will be there. VIP reception before film. 6pm. 2 times a year they receive a grant to bring films and filmmakers to Colorado. If JACL has speaker ideas, please let Kathryn know for brainstorming. November 14, 2013 7pm.
 - iii. Race. Are we so Different? History Colorado. Fall of 2014. Looking for speakers.
 - iv. Facing History is asking for ideas for speakers for community events and help bring a crowd. Ideas for guest speakers in the classrooms. Help build speaker bureaus queue. Come to their events. Help get the word out to the community. Field trip ideas where teachers can bring students to.
