2011 Gala Honorary Chairman



Washington D.C. July 5, 2011- The Japanese American Citizens League (JACL), the nation's oldest and largest Asian American civil and human rights organization, announces that the Honorable Norman Y. Mineta will serve as Honorary Chairman of its annual Gala. The JACL Gala was started five years ago and will be held on Thursday, September 29, 2011, at the J.W. Marriott Hotel in Washington, D.C.

Norman Mineta served as U.S. Secretary of Transportation under President George W. Bush and as Secretary of Commerce under President William Clinton. He had previously served as Mayor of the City of San Jose, California, and as a United States Congressman from California. He is currently a Vice President at Hill and Knowlton in Washington, D.C.

The JACL Gala is billed as a "Salute to Champions" and honors outstanding individuals who have made a difference by contributing to the causes in which the JACL is involved. Past Galas have honored members of Congress and other exceptional individuals who have served the nation in extraordinary ways. Secretary Mineta has been an honoree at a past JACL Gala, and his sister Etsu Mineta Masaoka who recently passed away, was honored last year. Corporations which have helped the JACL further its work have also received awards.

National JACL Executive Director Floyd Mori expressed appreciation to Secretary Mineta and his wife Deni. "We are extremely grateful to Norm and Deni for their continued support of the JACL Gala. They have given support and help to the JACL Gala since its inception. We appreciate all they have done for the JACL, for Japanese Americans, for the rest of the Asian American community, and for the nation as a whole."

David Kawamoto, National JACL President, stated: "Norman Mineta has given outstanding service to the JACL, and we are thankful to him for his continued support in so many ways including at our national conventions."

National JACL Convention

Washington D.C., July 14, 2011- The Japanese American Citizens League (JACL) held a successful 42nd National JACL Convention at the Renaissance Hotel in Hollywood, California on July 7-10. The Pacific Southwest District (PSW), under the guidance of Convention Chair Gary Mayeda, hosted this year's inaugural annual convention.

Prior to the convention, on Wednesday, July 6th, the National JACL Credit Union hosted a golf tournament at the Brookside Golf Course. That evening, the JACL National Youth/Student Council (NY/SC) held a welcome event for all youth attending the convention.



The official kick off to the 2011 convention began on Thursday, July 7th with a **National Board meeting**, Resolutions, Constitution/By-Laws, Credentials, and Program for Action **Committee Meetings**, **delegate orientation**, and a special youth presentation **"Destination Real Life"** by **State Farm's** AAPI Communities Public Affairs Representative **Leslie Moe-Kaiser** and California Public Affairs Representative **Felicia Van Frank**; the presentation focused on resume, interview, and career preparation. Throughout the afternoon, convention guests took fun photos with decorative props in the **official convention photo booth**. That evening, a **Welcome Reception at Madame Tussauds in Hollywood** allowed friends, old and new, to mingle with "Hollywood A-listers," (the wax versions).

On Friday, the convention delegates attended a **Federal and Corporate Partners breakfast**, visited with federal and local exhibitors at the various exhibitor booths, and participated in an all day business session.

This year's Awards Luncheon honored three local community heroes: Alan Nishio, Traci Kato-Kiriyama, and Paul Osaki with the Community Impact Award. Assemblyman Warren Furutani delivered a lively performance as Master of Ceremonies for the luncheon, and welcome remarks were made by JACL National President David Kawamoto, the Honorable Norman Y. Mineta, Executive Director of External Affairs of Comcast Corp. & Vice President of External Affairs for Comcast Cable, Johnnie Giles, Director of Public Affairs for Lilly USA, Dan Howle, and President and CEO of the National JACL Credit Union, Dean Hirabayashi. Artist and activist Nobuko Miyamoto, gave an entertaining and educational performance titled "Mottainai."

Friday evening featured a full schedule. A special **Whing Ding** event invited all Millennium and Thousand Club members. The **U.S. Environmental Protection Agency** sponsored a youth workshop titled "Environmental Justice and Federal Careers" and was presented by EPA representatives **Piyachat Terell,** National Program Manager for the White House Initiative on AAPIs and **Steven John**, Director of EPA Southern California Office. A special screening of the documentary "Vincent Who?" and Q&A with producer **Curtis Chin** also took place Friday night.

Saturday featured the 2011 Nikkei Conference co-hosted by the JACL and the California Japanese American Community Leadership Council (CJACLC). This unique conference featured workshops on the issues of Art and Culture, Civic Engagement and Leadership Development, Civil Rights, Community Development, Community Investment, Community Preservation, Historic Preservation, Serving Nikkei Seniors, and U.S.- Japan Relations. The goal of the conference was to bring together leaders throughout the nation and provide a forum for them to develop concrete action items to implement in the Japanese and larger AAPI community.

Following the special VIP reception hosted by Union Bank, the Culmination Banquet honored three outstanding National AAPI leaders: Lisa Hasegawa, Lieutenant Dan Choi, and Father Vien Nguyen. Actress and community advocate Tamlyn Tomita served as the Mistress of Ceremonies for the banquet. Special guests who spoke at the Culmination Banquet included Congresswoman Judy Chu, Ambassador of Japan to the United States Ichiro Fujisaki, California State Controller John Chiang, Leslie Moe-Kaiser of State Farm, Kim Delevett of Southwest Airlines, and David Lin of AT&T. A tribute to the late Etsu Mineta Masaoka, wife of the late Mike Masaoka and

sister of **the Honorable Norman Y. Mineta**, moved the convention attendees. A surprise farewell tribute video for current JACL National Executive Director, **Floyd Mori**, was revealed as a thank you in acknowledgment of his contributions to the JACL. **The Honorable Norman Y. Mineta, Congressman Mike Honda**, and **former JACL National Executive Director John Tateish**i made remarks honoring Mori's legacy. During the Culmination Banquet, the **NY/SC held a silent auction** under the leadership of National Youth Representative **Devin Yoshikawa** and National Youth Chairman **Matthew Farrells**.

On Sunday, the National Board met for a breakfast sponsored by **Walmart** and had a special Q&A session with the **IWGroup**. The NY/SC has a special youth meeting.

This season has been a long journey for the players on the Japanese women's soccer team, but on Sunday, it reached its conclusion when the Japanese players took the field against the U.S. in the final of the 2011 Women's World Cup in Frankfurt, Germany. Leading up to this day, at each of the previous games, Japan's players displayed a banner thanking the world for its support of their earthquake-ravaged country.

"As players, there is nothing much we can do for Japan, but we want to do as well as we can to help our country," said Sawa, the team's captain and on-field inspiration.

Norio Sasaki, Japan's coach, said the players are aware that their success in Germany has lifted spirits back home. "I think what we have been doing, so far, is very good for Japan," he said. "So many victims were hit by the disaster. Even little things, like a win, can give people courage and hope."

Although the impact of the earthquakes and tsunami continue, the magnificent performance by Japan's players has, even for a slight moment, allowed for the people who have been devastated by this tragedy, rejoice and celebrate their country. Congratulations to the players and to all of Japan.
