On April 3, the Consulate-General of Japan at Denver announced that Mr. Seiji Tanaka, Mr. Haruhisa Yamamoto, and Ikebana International Chapter 66 have been named as the Colorado recipients of The Commendation of the Consul General of Japan.

This award is a citation by the Consul General of Japan and is presented to honor the respected citizens and organizations who have made exceptional contributions in areas such as the development of mutual understanding and friendly ties between nations, the promotion of international cooperation in economic relations, the encouragement of cultural exchange, and other various activities which enhance the relationship of our two countries.

Also, in July 2008, when the annual National Conference of Japanese American National Museum was held in Denver, Mr. Tanaka, as then President of Japanese American Association of Colorado, contributed greatly to the success of the Conference. Besides these contributions, he has been serving organize many cultural activities for the Japanese American community.

Mr. Haruhisa Yamamoto, former owner of Denver Tofu Company, has contributed greatly in promoting Japanese foods and its food culture in Colorado. For the 40 years since he became owner of Denver Tofu Company in 1973, he has made great efforts to popularize healthy Japanese food and brought Japanese foods to the kitchens and homes of the people of Colorado.

Ikebana International Chapter 66, one of 69 branches of Ikebana International in the United States, has contributed greatly in enhancing mutual understanding, friendship, and goodwill between Japan and Denver and Northern Colorado for 50 years since its establishment through introduction of ikebana and other Japanese culture. 



Annual Pilgrimage to Amache

In 1976, the first formal Pilgrimage to Amache was organized by the activist group Asian American CARP (Community Action Research Program). CARP members reconnoitered the concentration camp site for rattlesnakes and other hazards prior to the arrival of the first bus which was filled mainly with Issei, first generation Japanese. For most of the Issei, it was the first trip back to the site of their nearly four-year long imprisonment during World War II. Third generation Sansei and a second generation Nisei, who translated for the groups, made up the rest of the contingent.

The cemetery was still surrounded by barbed wire with a cattle-guard at the gate to protect the headstones from grazing livestock. A small brick building at the cemetery housed the enscribed memorial stone left by Amache inmates shortly before the camp closed. Vandals had shot at the memorial stone, leaving it pocked marked by bullets. After cleaning up the cemetery and laying flowers at the headstones, the group drove a mile east to the town of Granada where a Japanese American resident let the former prisoners eat a potluck lunch in her front yard. The round-trip bus ride provided time for discussion at a point in Japanese American history when we were still finding our voice and looking into the ramifications of our forced removal and imprisonment.

In 1983, the Denver Central Optimists Club took over responsibility for organizing the annual Pilgrimage. The Optimists, now called the Amache Club, continue to organize the annual Pilgrimage along with the Friends of Amache, the Japanese American Association of Colorado, and the Amache Preservation Society under the guidance of Granada High School teacher, John Hopper.

The annual Pilgrimage always takes place on the Saturday before Memorial Day weekend. In 2012, the Pilgrimage will take place on Saturday, May 19th. A chartered bus will pick up passengers from either the Simpson United Methodist Church at 6:00 a.m. or the Tri-State Denver Buddhist Temple at 6:30 a.m. The bus arrives at the Amache cemetery around 11:00 a.m. where floral offerings are made at a religious service. A potluck lunch is held in the cafeteria of Granada High School. Afterward, entertainment will be provided by Junior Denver Taiko and project architect Barbara Darden will report on the progress of restoration work at Amache. Artifacts from the Amache Museum will be on display at Granada High School. The bus leaves for Denver about 2:30 p.m. with arrival back in Denver about 6:30 p.m.
